

Daughter of Zion ideas to ponder:

The phrase "Daughter of Zion" in the Bible generally refers to **Jerusalem or the Jewish people**.²⁴ It is a metaphor for the loving, caring, and patient relationship God has with His chosen people. The phrase is mentioned several times in the Old Testament, usually in prophecy and once in poetry.³ Initially, the city is positively likened to a daughter, protected under God's special regard, but later, under the Babylonian siege, she is devastated, even ravaged.⁰ The phrase is mentioned fewer than 20 times in the entire Bible, and the only time she is spoken of in the New Testament is in a prophecy from Zechariah.
